Chamber rebrand reflects modern vibe

Brentwood Chamber has rebranded ahead of the new decade - with a new image to better reflect its work as a pro-active and modern body.

Deserved or not, over recent years the Chamber has been saddled with the label of being old-fashioned and just for the older, established companies in the Borough. The reality, in this year more than ever and with ever-evolving plans as we head towards 2020, is that Brentwood Chamber is accessible to everyone.

There was a need to show that the Chamber is a modern, dynamic organisation, responding to the needs of a growing membership.

Hence the thought of a bright, colourful logo, in keeping with modern trends was born; branding to stimulate local young entrepreneurs, and SMEs through to large organisations building bonds and collaborations not just with local businesses but also those further afield.

The Chamber's executive committee was canvassed, with views put to designer Bob Clark of Greenhouse Marketing, who came up with six possible options.

The Greek beta was seen to represent the name of the town and this, in different colours, together with the text words in different formats and different colours, was put to the vote of attendees at the August Business Breakfast, and a subsequent executive committee meeting.
