The Brentwood Environmental Business Alliance gets off to an encouraging start

Co-founded by Brentwood Borough Council and Brentwood-based Baker Labels Ltd, the Alliance commits businesses to making the most sustainable business decisions, to reduce their environmental impact.

With 25 local businesses signed up at its launch, December's meeting brought them together to shape and agree the principles of the Alliance and to share their own experiences of introducing environmentally friendly practices.
