"The Great Switch off" Explained by LG Networks



ADVANCED NETWORK SOLUTIONS
FOR VOICE AND DATA

In 2017, Openreach announced 'The Great Switch off', to replace all legacy copper and analogue services with internet based connections by 2025. The network simply isn't advanced enough for all UK lines to be

moved over to 'IP' (i.e. internet protocol, the most common being 'Voice over Internet Protocol', or VoIP – i.e. internet based phone services) by next year.

The majority of ISDN lines – the standard of business lines for the past 30-40 years – have been migrated already and it is LG Networks' opinion that Openreach will actually cease the remainder at the end of next year.

If you are still using ISDN or analogue lines as your business phone service then you need to discuss your options urgently with your current or prospective provider. If your broadband service still uses an analogue line with either ADSL2 or FTTC (i.e. old copper based connections) then you also need to look at upgrading this as Openreach claim these services will also be withdrawn next year.

If you still have any legacy products (ISDN, analogue lines, ADSL, FTTC) then contact <u>LG Networks</u> to get the latest information.
